# Message from UFI's President



### Dear UFI Colleagues,

Crisis management after a major tragedy is something in which many of us have been involved in one way or another. Few, however, have been involved in a combination of catastrophic loss of life, injuries, physical and emotional distress, property damage, and adverse impact to life and business that reach enormous proportions.

The earthquake in China's Sichuan Province on 12 May and subsequent after shocks have been horrific examples of what can occur. At the time of writing this column, the number of confirmed deaths are 68,858 and nearly 20,000 are still reported missing. There are 366,586 persons known to have been injured.

I happened to be in Sichuan Province some 150 miles from the epicentre on 12 May. Fortunately, and though at risk, I experienced nothing but frightening seconds during the shaking each time and a great deal of inconvenience getting out of the northern mountains of Sichuan. I hesitate to even mention this in light of the victims and what they have gone through - and will continue to go through - well into the future. A critical situation looms there for millions of homeless, especially the injured and those who have lost friends and loved ones.

It has been encouraging, however, that so many have assisted. For example, contributions from all over the world have reached over US\$5 billion. But, this will only help. More assistance is needed. I attended the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Industry Association Annual Dinner last evening (30 May). Its members, including exhibition organisers and contractors and exhibition venue managers, many who are UFI members, contributed another US\$80,000 to the relief effort.

The exhibition industry in the region has been adversely impacted. For example, the Chengdu International Convention & Exposition Center, UFI's member in Chengdu (the capital of the Province where the UFI sponsored China Expo Forum for International Cooperation (CEFCO) was held this past January), has lost enormous amounts of business. Even so, the management team there has come together to assist in an extraordinary way. Business Director XU Shuang (Bessie) wrote to us stating, "A violent earthquake struck Sichuan, our beautiful and beloved hometown. Since then, each of us has volunteered in the Earthquake Relief Work. As for my company, we not only donated money to the affected areas, but also have worked closely with the Army. For example, we offered our exhibition halls for temporarily storing relief materials and supplied our soldiers with accommodation. Currently, quake relief work has entered the most crucial phase. We Chinese are frantically rebuilding our homeland, standing together in doing so!"

What an example our valued members are setting there in Sichuan, indeed. On behalf of UFI, I applaud them.

Though such tragedies as this can not be properly and thoroughly planned for, let us all be prepared to deal with incidents of crisis. We must help as we can in doing our part in utilizing the resources available to us or that we can influence to the benefit those around us.

# Exhibition industry responds to Sichuan earthquake

The attention of the world has been focused in May on the devastating earthquake which struck Sichuan province in south-west China on the May 12.

UFI's member in Chengdu, the provincial capital of Sichuan, is the New International Convention & Exposition Center, Century City. Our contacts there report that all staff and the centre are safe and that "the entire exhibition and travel group of the Chengdu centre is now participating in the disaster relief activities. The centre and staff are all helping the volunteers, soldiers and officials who come back from the front-line activities. The venue also offers places to these people for resting as well as used as storage for back-up materials".

A number of UFI's members in Asia have been raising funds for the disaster relief activities.

As he described in his message on page 3 of this UFI Info, UFI President Cliff Wallace was visiting Sichuan at the time of the earthquake but has now returned safely to Hong Kong.

ExCel London has been sold to the **Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Company** (ADNEC). This development will see ExCel become London's biggest conference and events centre.




